What is PACE®?

PACE helps older adults maintain their health, independence, and safety in the comfort of their own home. We provide transportation from your home to the PACE Day Center. We deliver all medical care, therapy, and prescriptions. We offer meals, recreational activities, and chances to socialize. Home care is also available. Our goal is to keep participants living independently at home and avoid long stays in a nursing home.

PERSONALIZED CARE TO MEET YOUR NEEDS

First, our Interdisciplinary Team (IDT) will get to know you and assess your care needs. The PACE IDT team members represent a variety of healthcare expertise, both medical and non-medical.

IDT creates a unique plan of care for each participant. The plan details what services we will provide, where, and how often. The plan respects your rights, independence, and goals. We evaluate the plan on a regular schedule or as needed. Family and care partners are important and involved in the process.





WHERE IS PACE CARE PROVIDED?

IN THE HOME:

Our care team provides in home services. This includes case management, nursing tasks, therapies, personal care and housekeeping. PACE also refills and delivers prescriptions.

AT THE THOME PACE DAY CENTER:

You can receive medical and supportive services at our Day Center, with door-to-door transportation to and from your home. A geriatric physician oversees all primary and urgent care in our PACE medical clinic. Our expert geriatric care team helps coordinate your care. In addition, you can enjoy meals, activities, and opportunities to socialize. You can also receive therapies such as physical, occupational, speech, and recreational therapy, to help you stay engaged and maintain your independence.

THROUGH SPECIALISTS AND SERVICES:

Thome PACE makes available all services that you may need.

These include specialists, hospital, emergency, caregiver respite, hospice, and skilled nursing care.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR PACE, YOU MUST BE:

- √55 years of age or older.
- ✓ Live in the service area of a PACE organization. Thome PACE serves older adults living in Jackson, Hillsdale, and Lenawee counties.
- ✓ Certified by the State of Michigan as meeting the need for nursing home level care*.
- ✓ Able to live safely in the community with the help of PACE services at the time of joining.
- *Nursing home level of care means someone is struggling physically or with their memory or has an unstable health condition. With a simple call, our PACE intake team can evaluate and provide an eligibility assessment.

WHAT IS THE COST OF PACE®?

What you pay for Thome PACE depends on your financial situation. Participants enrolled in both Medicare and Medicaid, or just Medicaid alone, have no co-payments or deductibles. Our enrollment team can assist with new Medicaid applications. With Medicare alone, there is a cost-sharing option. Once you become a PACE participant, you must receive all your needed health care, including primary care from Thome PACE and specialty care from a provider authorized by Thome PACE. You may be fully and personally liable for the costs of medical services from an out-of-network provider or without prior PACE authorization (with the exception of emergency services).
